Due to outdated Zoning Rehabilitation Plan and Planning Permit, the best outcome for the community will not be achievable.  To facilitate preferred outcome, amendment of the statutory framework for approval from EcoDev of an amended Rehabilitation Plan with support from community and Knox City Council  Work with Knox City Council to amend Planning Scheme approval for updated overlays to reflect new post closure rehabilitation and redevelopment plans.  Obtain amended Planning Permits  New rehabilitation plan will require a Work Plan variation.  Questions arising during presentation:  Will Knox City Council purchase the property covered by the Public Acquisition Overlay?  PD advised that Council does not want to increase its maintenance costs by purchasing the land  DF advised that if Parks Victoria do not want the land to complement the Churchill National Park, then the current rehabilitation plan is impacted.  If current permits are outdated, are they legal?  DF advised that all plans and permits are legal, but not necessarily compliant with current legislation. It is not a tool with which the regulator can regulate.  Laws for Work Plan Variations changed in 2010 allowing both the Planning Permit and Work Authority to be updated in tandem.
