Mobile crushing of production shot 1 scheduled for late February, A low production turnover is scheduled for March 2014 Power supply instalment to the site office is scheduled for March. Site water storage dams have been constructed the silt dam has been lined & completed; the 10mgl storage dam has been lined & completed & the security has also been erected & completed around the dams. 7.1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Approval documentation from both the Crowne Lands Department & Cabonne Council have been received for the commencement of works on East Guyong Cemetery Cabonne Councils Heritage advisor David Scobie has provided the following recommendations they are as follows, <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The 300m steel stock proof fencing 1m outside the line of the existing on three sides is appropriate, subject to details for the wire, star pickets and timber corner posts and strainers; There is no requirement for reducing the planting around the perimeter other than that required for the stabilisation of the rare original fence posts; There is no requirement for pulling down the old fence or removing hawthorn plantings; Construct two standard stone gabion walls at the Knapp Street entrance Construct two bench seats using stone filled gabions with timber plank bench seat planks at locations within the Cemetery to be agreed Construct a set of low gabion walls as a vehicle barrier to the top of Knapp street, as per the sketch proposal In the south east corner of the road reserve left turn, construct a single picnic setting using low gabions and solid timber planks, as close as is reasonable to take shade from the large existing trees; Construct paved elements in decomposed granite or similar local quarried materials as noted to the entry and seats Clean up in the Cemetery only in the tree area for the rest spaces noting the legal protection of the place under the Relics provisions of the NSW Heritage Act. New paint finish to the restored picket fencing and wicket gate at the entry using Dulux Lime White. Items 1, 2, 3, 9 & 10 are to commence immediately A quote has been submitted & approval has been granted by the CCC for the fence work to commence, scheduled for March 2014. With the remaining funds a head stone mason/repairer has been sourced, a quote is yet to be submitted, depending on the amount of damage to a headstone the price range will be from \$300 - \$2000, if all of the headstones cannot be repaired than priority would take place on the headstones with significant damage. Quaker reversing indicators will be installed on all Hanson incoming yellow machines before they arrive to site, however due to construction contractual restraints machines being used for the construction phase of the quarry, Hanson is unable to nominate Quakers to be used, In regards to road transport vehicles .i.e. Truck & Dogs, all Hanson owned road transport vehicles i.e. Truck & Dogs will be fitted with Quaker's before they are posted at the quarry (TG) The weather station..... should not the results of that be included in the quarterly review? An incomplete and inaccurate set were used to support Hanson's application in original ESI and now that you have a complete set they are not used. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I also believe the access to average user is not very friendly as the average person is unlikely to even consider entering going to the website of a gravel quarry for such information. As per the PA there is no official quarterly review required, the public has direct access to the Hanson website, (www.hanson.com.au), therefore no additional results will be submitted or reported on at this time, however all required data can be obtained, downloaded, formatted as required via the Hanson website. The current website access meets the requirements so therefore access to the website is unalterable, due to Hanson the company's policy's & for security purposes the weather station link can only be accessed through the Hanson East Guyong website www.hanson.com.au & no links will be provided & or issued. (TG)Ground water levels..... Is it possible to arrange a meeting with the people you use to monitor this to give those of us interested a talk on the process of collecting and reporting the data? Needless to say groundwater issues are becoming more critical every day. We have had two bores going dry in the last 12 months. Unfortunately a meet with the people who collect the data from the bores is not possible at this point & time, however a quarterly Standing water level report will be made available at each CCC meeting. It must also be noted that from January 2014 water is no longer being drawn from the Quinton bore.
