The 300m steel stock proof fencing 1m outside the lin of the existing on three sides is appropriate, subject to details for the wire, star pickets and timber corner pos and strainers; 2. There is no requirement for reducing the planting around the perimeter other than that required for the stabilisation of the rare original fence posts; 3. There is no requirement for pulling down the old fence or removing hawthorn plantings; 4. Construct two standard stone gabion walls at the Kna Street entrance 5.
