SUBJECT: PROJECT UPDATE #2

Thank you to those people who attended the Community Information Session in March, and took the time to complete and submit their issues or concerns regarding the proposed development of Bunyip North Quarry.

Based on the information provided on the 57 completed questionnaires, and direct communication Hanson has had with residents since that time, the following data has been provided to the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) to ensure community concerns are considered within the development of the EES Scoping Requirements.

This information was also provided by Hanson to the Technical Reference Group (TRG) at their first meeting conducted by DELWP last month to ensure community concerns are considered by DELWP and the relevant referral authorities during the development of the Scoping Requirements for EES.

A TRG is a group of representatives from government agencies, local government and statutory authorities, and is appointed to provide advice to Hanson and DELWP during the preparation of the EES.

DELWP has advised Hanson that it expects the draft EES Scoping document to be available for public exhibition and comment in July 2017.

To ensure the community has all the information they require and every opportunity to register their issues or concerns with the Scoping Document, Hanson will host an Open House forum at the Tonimbuk Equestrian Centre in the first week of the public exhibition period. As soon as the public exhibition period dates are confirmed by DELWP, Hanson will notify you directly, advertise the event in the Berwick Pakenham Gazette and distribute posters to be displayed at community hubs.
