	 Air Quality Management Plan for submission to DPE as they would need to approve any relocation of air quality monitoring points. EPL-2193 to be varied by the EPA imminently to include a condition relating to commissioning an air quality professional to write a proposal for a revised (real-time) air quality monitoring system
	MA: Will the real-time data be publicly available? SB: At this stage it looks like it will not be publicly available CF: Currently, PM ₁₀ monitoring data is published in the Annual Review (AR). We would likely need to publish real-time data within the AR.
5.4	 Independent Environmental Audit (CF) Audit completed by IEMA on 05/09/2023 - 06/09/2023 Report lodged to DPE 06/12/2023 DPE accepted the report on 12 December 2023 [not an endorsement of compliance status] The report and accompanying action plan are both on the BPQ website
	CF: Overall BPQ performed well and better than the last audit. Most non-compliances had already been notified to DPE & EPA as required but nonetheless constitute a NC for the audit period. MA: Was there a common theme for the non-compliances? CF: Water and dust monitoring non-compliances. SB: One blasting non-compliance. LB: Also a transport non-compliance.

6.1	Blasting – excessive ground vibrations (01/12/2023) • As per complaints register.
7.0	General / New Business
7.1	 Resignation of MA as Independent Chairperson (MA) Notified DPE on 9th January 2024 of resignation from all 5 CCCs chaired, including BPQ. MA will attend the next meeting in May as his final BPQ CCC meeting. Process: DPE has a pool of 48 approved Independent Chairpersons (ICs), DPE has sent out to the pool for EOIs. DPE will then try to align a suitable IC geographically. MA has requested that the new IC attend the May meeting for handover.
7.2	 Traffic impacts of new Shellharbour hospital (JH) Should Hanson head office contact the hospital, RMS etc. regarding the expected traffic impacts of the development? A community group has already formed. SB: Hanson will make a formal submission when contacted by DPE. JH: Has this already happened? SB: Our understanding is that DPE will need to display information about the project publicly, this may include traffic impacts. NC: A stakeholder working group would be formed to discuss the development, likely including stakeholders on this CCC (Hanson, Council, NPWS, The Links Shell Cove). MO: Council has a traffic committee, the expectation is that the traffic committee will discuss the hospital development. SB to check whether Hanson has been contacted about the development.

7.3	 Killalea Draft Plan of Management (NC) Draft Plan of Management submissions closed last week. NPWS received 193 submissions, including a submission from Hanson. These submissions are under review.
7.4	 Trespassers on the jetty (LB) Contacted SB re: kids trespassing on the jetty and were jumping off the pier while divers were below the pier, presenting a risk to both jumpers and divers. LB believes this could also be a public liability issue for Hanson. SB: Hanson appreciate the notification, managing trespasser access on the jetty is a recurring challenge.
7.5	 Dust improvements (LB) LB requested an update on dust controls in place on site. SB: Environmentally friendly dust suppression chemicals are being trialled on roads. Watercart being scheduled over the weekend (based on weather forecast). Trial of dust suppression foaming agent in the fixed plant (Polo Citrus) has commenced; this was used successfully on the old plant. Close to commissioning dust extraction system in the screenhouse. Doors reinstated on the screenhouse (to replace butchers' doors). LB: Are the impacts of these improvements quantifiable? SB: Not currently, other than visual. But that is part of the value of the real-time monitor program being driven by the EPA. LB: Has there been any progress with roadworks at entrance of BPQ Road? SB: There have been minor improvements and maintenance along the verge. Larger roadworks are budgeted for Q1 2024 to address the recurring water issue.
